<u>Time</u>

Setting: The deck of the Cruise Ship Folly. Three lounge chairs are set in a line, facing the audience at center.

At Rise: Bob is in the chair left, reading a magazine. Joe enters from R and sits in chair right, leaving the center chair vacant. He finds a magazine on his chair and flips through it.

Silence follows.
