GREENBERG is first seen only from behind. She dances as if with a partner, her own hands at her back and then on her waist, holding her as she dances. Her hands embrace her as the dance ends.

LEVY comments on the activity with his face as he reads his newspaper. His eyes indicate this has been going on night after night. He smiles and shakes his head as the song comes to an end...
